September 5, 2017

The University of California Student Association (UCSA) strongly condemns President Trump's decision to eliminate DACA. We stand in solidarity with our undocumented community and will continue to fight for their ability to pursue their educational dreams and be placed on a pathway to citizenship.

It is unacceptable to play politics with the lives of the 800,000 undocumented immigrants who contribute to our communities and economy. The choices our leaders make now have real and lasting consequences for all Americans in the years to come. We call on Congress to alleviate the fear and uncertainty of those enrolled in DACA and to enact legislation that will lead us towards comprehensive immigration reform.
